News from the Tamar Valley Donkey Park June 2003

Hello from all the donkeys! Thank you for adopting one of us last year. We are pleased to be able to tell you that we had a much better year last year. Foot and Mouth went away and our visitors all came back, so we had plenty of carrots. The season started off very well with the busiest day we have ever had on Good Friday.

Our people had a very special year, because in July a new little person was born. Our person Tamsin had a baby girl called Bethany, so we now know we will have people to look after us for many years to come! Although only 11 months old now, she already likes to ride on our backs.

Arkle, Colleen, Copper and Karina have once more been out and about representing the Park. Arkle and Colleen went to Church on Palm Sunday. Arkle would not go into Church, he does not like gratings, so the congregation had to pat him on the way in and out. Colleen went to St. Cleer Church and behaved perfectly for the whole service and then walked down the aisle so that the people could take Palm Crosses out of the baskets she was carrying on her back. They went together to Callington Gala Day in July, to an open day at the Vets in Tavistock in May and to Trago Mills Store at Christmas. The Vet suggested he had special feed every day and he was allowed to wander the Park whenever there were no visitors. He was beginning to look really well, however one evening in late January this year when rain was expected over night, so we were all in the Donkey House, Hugh suddenly fell to the ground, so we all eeyored very loudly and Tamsin came running to see what was the matter. Our people sent for the Vet at once, but it was too late. The Vet said that this can happen very suddenly like this with liver disease. We all miss him and his cheeky ways very much.
